

Each March, Women's History Month gives schools a meaningful opportunity to recognize the many ways women have shaped our world. The TeachersFirst Women's History Month resource collection provides a wide range of tools to help educators and students explore these stories in engaging ways. The site includes lesson plans, primary sources, biographies, videos, and interactive activities that highlight women's contributions across many fields and time periods.

Several collections within the site focus on women as changemakers, including Women in STEM, Women for Freedom, Pioneering Women, and Young Women Who Have Changed the World. Lake Mills has attended the Youth Unity Summit all three years, and each time their students and leaders leave energized with new ideas and renewed motivation to make a positive impact in their school community. After this year's summit, Kaley shared one of the ideas the Lake Mills team is excited to try. Through conversations within their chapter, Lake Mills United, students reflected on how athletics often receive the most recognition in their community, particularly boys' sports teams. While athletics are an important part of school culture, students wanted to find ways to celebrate and support the many other activities that make their school vibrant.

To help broaden that support, Lake Mills United is partnering with SLAAC (Student Leadership Athlete Advisory Council) to create a fun and engaging participation initiative. The idea is to design a punch card similar to a BINGO card that includes squares representing a wide range of school events such as sporting events, music performances, theatre productions, service opportunities, homecoming activities, and more. Students will receive the card when they register or pick up their school ID. Each time a student attends an event, they'll receive a punch on their card. Once they complete a BINGO or fill the entire card, they will earn a prize. The goal is simple but powerful: encourage students to show up for one another, explore different activities, and celebrate the many talents and interests that make their school community strong.

We love this idea because it highlights what We Are Many United is all about—connection, participation, and supporting one another across activities and interests. We can't wait to see how this initiative unfolds. Keep us posted, Lake Mills! **Go L-Cats!**
